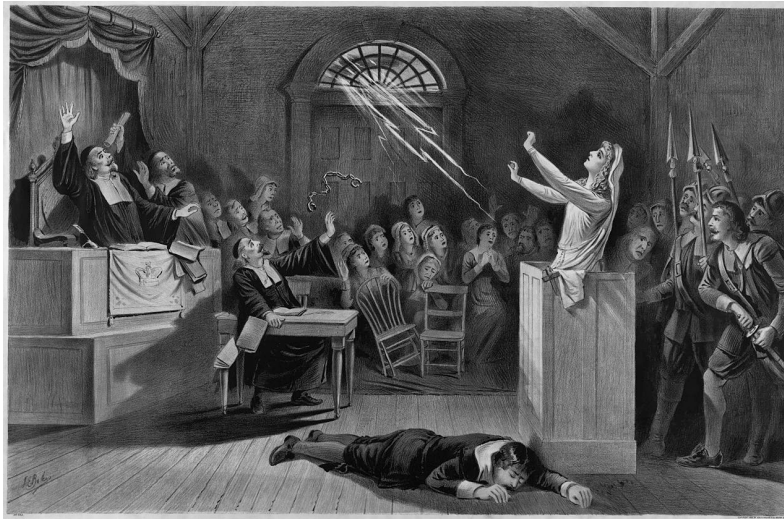


The Salem Witch Trials
